The Father-Son Relationship

John 5:16-30 ¹⁶Now because Jesus was doing these things on the Sabbath, the Jews began to persecute Him. ¹⁷But Jesus answered them, "To this very day My Father is at His work, and I too am working." ¹⁸Because of this, the Jews tried all the harder to kill Him. Not only was He breaking the Sabbath, but He was even calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God. ¹⁹So Jesus replied, "Truly, truly, I tell you, the Son can do nothing by Himself, unless He sees the Father doing it. For whatever the Father does, the Son also does. ²⁰The Father loves the Son and shows Him all He does. And to your amazement, He will show Him even greater works than these. ²¹For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom He wishes. ²²Furthermore, the Father judges no one, but has assigned all judgment to the Son, ²³so that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him. ²⁴Truly, truly, I tell you, whoever hears My word and believes Him who sent Me has eternal life and will not come under judgment. Indeed, he has crossed over from death to life. ²⁵Truly, truly, I tell you, the hour is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. ²⁶For as the Father has life in Himself, so also He has granted the Son to have life in Himself. ²⁷And He has given Him authority to execute judgment, because He is the Son of Man. ²⁸Do not be amazed at this, for the hour is coming when all who are in their graves will hear His voice ²⁹ and come out—those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil to the resurrection of judgment. ³⁰I can do nothing by Myself; I judge only as I hear. And My judgment is just, because I do not seek My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. (BSB)

- I. Jesus claims to have <u>life</u> within Himself. V.26
- **J.** Jesus claims to be the *head* of the human race. V.27

- II. Let us interpret this through the filter of parable of the sower.
 - **A.** Rocks: There are many false beliefs that will prevent these truths from impacting our life. The main one is that Jesus probably <u>didn't say</u> these things. The disciples just made this up.
 - **B.** Weeds: Many will dismiss these statements because of the <u>price</u> that follows the true believers in Jesus Christ. All will face some persecution; many will die for their belief in Him.
 - **C.** Hard Heart: This doesn't make <u>sense</u> to them and it will get chalked up as just a religious thing.
 - **D.** A healthy heart will choose to <u>believe and allow</u> whatever consequences to this belief to happen and to accept them with joy.
