Scripture.

Intro and Recap: Here were the four changes that people who were raised in the American churches, and who identify as LGBT+, would like to see made in their home churches. We addressed the first two last week and here is what we are doing to address the request for change.

- *Listen to them and let them tell their story. (We here at NMMC encourage our members to develop trusting friendships with them. We should treat them with kindness. Jesus died for them as well as us. We talked about last week what Scripture has to say about how to deal with members who are actively involved in sin and is refusing to repent.)
- *Be consistent in our treatment of people caught up in behavior that is not in alignment with biblical truth. (We here at NMMC accept anyone to come and worship with us. We have three levels of belonging and we do not single out anyone and treat them different from others.)

The two that we will address today are these:

*Ask them to define the words that they use, don't assume.

*Love them without compromising biblical truth.
