Paul's View on The Local Church

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Acts 18:24-28 ²⁴Meanwhile a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria, came to Ephesus. He was an eloquent man, well versed in the Scriptures. ²⁵He had been instructed in the way of the Lord and was fervent in spirit. He spoke and taught accurately about Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. ²⁶And he began to speak boldly in the synagogue. When Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him in and explained to him the way of God more accurately. ²⁷When Apollos resolved to cross over to Achaia, the brothers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples there to welcome him. On his arrival, he was a great help to those who by grace had believed. ²⁸For he powerfully refuted the Jews in public debate, proving from the Scriptures that Jesus is the Christ. (BSB)

I Corinthians 3:1-23 ¹Brothers, I could not address you as spiritual, but as worldly—as infants in Christ. ²I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for solid food. In fact, you are still not ready, ³ for you are still worldly. For since there is jealousy and dissension among you, are you not worldly? Are you not walking in the way of man? 4For when one of you says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not mere men? 5What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? They are servants through whom you believed, as the Lord has assigned to each his role. ⁶I planted the seed and Apollos watered it, but God made it grow. ⁷So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. 8He who plants and he who waters are one in purpose, and each will be rewarded according to his own labor. 9For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building. 10 By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as an expert builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one must be careful how he builds. ¹¹For no one can lay a foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. ¹²If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw, ¹³his workmanship will be evident, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will prove the quality of each man's work. ¹⁴If what he has built survives, he will receive a reward. ¹⁵If it is burned up, he will suffer loss. He himself will be saved, but only as if through the flames. 16Do you not know that you yourselves are God's temple, and that God's Spirit dwells in you? ¹⁷If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him; for God's temple is holy, and you are that temple. ¹⁸Let no one deceive himself. If any of you thinks he is wise in this age, he should become a fool, so that he may become wise. ¹⁹For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in God's sight. As it is written: "He catches the wise in their craftiness." ²⁰And again, "The Lord knows that the thoughts of the wise are futile." ²¹Therefore, stop boasting in men. All things are yours, 22 whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future. All of them belong to you, ²³ and you belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God. (BSB)

- I. What does this passage tell us about Paul's View of the Local Church?
 - A. Not all local churches have the same *maturity* level. V.1-3
 - B. There were different styles of church even back then. V.4-6
 - **C.** The emphasis of a local church should not be on the <u>human</u> leadership but on the Lord, Himself. V.7-9
 - **D.** The *quality* of our labor as ministers will be tested by time and circumstances. *Everyone* has a ministry in the local church. V.10-15
 - **E.** Every local church is <u>sacred</u> in God's eyes and He holds the life of a local church in high esteem. V.16
 - **F.** Every local church must put their <u>trust</u> in Christ alone. V.17-23
- **II.** What can we learn from these truths?
 - A. <u>Divisions</u> and <u>strife</u> show areas in a local church that are not mature in Christ.
 - **B.** Denominations are <u>not evil</u>. There have always been differences in how to do church.
 - **C.** Local churches should look for ways of cooperation for the Church *universal* to continue to become mature.
 - **D.** We must strive to keep our local church *holy* and *whole*.
 - **E.** Jesus Christ has got to be the <u>center</u> of every local church that we associate with.
