## The Cup of Thanksgiving

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I Corinthians 10:14-17 <sup>14</sup>Therefore, my dear friends, flee from idolatry. <sup>15</sup>I speak to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. <sup>16</sup>Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? <sup>17</sup>Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf. (NIV)

**Intro:** There are three applications of the terms body and blood of the Lord.

- \*The literal body and blood of Jesus Christ is *His earthly body*.
- \*The symbolic body and blood of Jesus Christ is the <u>bread and juice</u> used in communion.
- \*The figurative body and blood of Jesus Christ is the <u>church</u> and the <u>Holy Spirit</u> interacting through our relationships with one another.
- **I.** Here are the key details of this passage.
  - A. We are to *flee* from idolatry. V.14
  - **B.** When we participate in the *cup of thanksgiving* we are participating in the body and blood of the Christ. V.15-16
  - C. A healthy unity should come out of our communion services. V.17
- **II.** How should this affect us?
  - A. We must renounce all forms of idolatry.
  - B. We must *confess* our sins and seek restoration in our human relationships.
  - **C.** We must <u>receive</u> the unity of our local church that God wants to give us.
