Paul's View on Christmas

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Galatians 4:3-7 ³So also, when we were children, we were enslaved under the basic principles of the world. ⁴But when the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵to redeem those under the law, that we might receive our adoption as sons. ⁶And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!" ⁵So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, you are also an heir through God. BSB

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
 - **A.** The context of this passage is the <u>heresy</u> of legalism. Legalism is the belief that we can earn God's grace by our righteous acts. It believes that we also keep God's grace by a strict observance of do's and don'ts.
 - **B.** Before Christ we were slaves to our *carnal* nature. V.3
 - C. The Christmas story was the culmination of dozens of <u>prophecies</u> that had to be <u>fulfilled</u> in the coming of the Messiah. V. 4
 - **D.** Even the Law abiding needed to be <u>adopted as sons</u> through the Messiah. V.5
 - **E.** The *Holy Spirit* is the proof of our adoption, not our strict observance of the Law. V.6-7
- **II.** What can we learn from this?
 - **A.** A <u>mature</u> believer will not be constantly looking for the mistakes of others but instead will be loving them, as a part of their spiritual family, to imitate Jesus Christ in their actions.
 - **B.** <u>Knowing</u> the prophecies and the fulfillment of them in Christ will be something that we need to learn as part of sharing the story of Christ with others.
 - **C.** We need to replace religion with <u>relationships</u>. Grace is the key to this.
 - **D.** We need to learn **obedience** and **surrender** to the Holy Spirit.
