## The Beginning of Wisdom

**Proverbs 1:1-7** <sup>1</sup>These are the proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel, <sup>2</sup>for gaining wisdom and discipline, for comprehending words of insight, <sup>3</sup>and for receiving instruction in wise living and in righteousness, justice, and equity. <sup>4</sup>To impart prudence to the simple and knowledge and discretion to the young, <sup>5</sup>let the wise listen and gain instruction, and the discerning acquire wise counsel <sup>6</sup>by understanding the proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise. <sup>7</sup>The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline. (BSB)

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
  - A. The book of Proverbs was written by **Solomon**, son of King David. V. 1
  - **B.** Proverbs are for helping us to live the life that God <u>intended</u>. V.2-4 Here are a few definitions that are important here. The goal is wise living.
    - <u>Wisdom</u> the ability to accurately apply information when appropriately needed. V.2
    - 2. <u>Discipline</u> The ability to not give in to fleshly urges and to restrain imprudent behavior. V.2
    - **3.** The <u>Simple</u> This is someone who is the opposite of being wise. They are someone who lacks wisdom. V.4
    - 4. **Prudence** The quality of being cautious. V.4
    - **5.** <u>Discretion</u> The quality of speaking or behaving in such a way as to not to offend or to reveal harmful information to others. V.4
  - C. Proverbs are not just meant to be heard but to be **skillfully** applied. V.5
  - **D.** The beginning of living the way that God intended is to have a healthy, biblically sound fear of *YHWH*. V.7
- II. What can we learn from this?
  - **A.** We live in a day and age of **fools**. The grownups have mostly died and there is a need to get back to basics. It needs to start with us!
  - **B.** It is not enough to know Scripture. We must be <u>wise</u> in our application and use of it.
  - **C.** The *Fear of the LORD*, YHWH, has got to be our number one motivating factor in every aspect of our life. We will someday have to give account for everything we did or said.
    - **Il Corinthians 5:10** For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive his due for the things done in the body, whether good or bad. BSB
