## Tongue Entanglements

**Proverbs 10:10-21, 31-32** <sup>10</sup>He who winks the eye causes grief, and foolish lips will come to ruin. <sup>11</sup>The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence. <sup>12</sup>Hatred stirs up dissension, but love covers all transgressions. <sup>13</sup>Wisdom is found on the lips of the discerning, but a rod is for the back of him who lacks judgment. <sup>14</sup>The wise store up knowledge, but the mouth of the fool invites destruction. <sup>15</sup>The wealth of the rich man is his fortified city, but poverty is the ruin of the poor. <sup>16</sup>The labor of the righteous leads to life, but the gain of the wicked brings punishment. <sup>17</sup>Whoever heeds instruction is on the path to life, but he who ignores reproof goes astray. <sup>18</sup>The one who conceals hatred has lying lips, and whoever spreads slander is a fool. <sup>19</sup>When words are many, sin is unavoidable, but he who restrains his lips is wise. <sup>20</sup>The tongue of the righteous is choice silver, but the heart of the wicked has little worth. <sup>21</sup>The lips of the righteous feed many, but fools die for lack of judgment.

<sup>31</sup>The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but a perverse tongue will be cut out. <sup>32</sup>The lips of the righteous know what is fitting, but the mouth of the wicked is perverse. (BSB)

- I. Here are the details of this passage that relate to the issue of our tongues.
  - A. Our tongues have great *power*. V.10-12
  - B. Wise words will spare us of so many griefs. V.13-14
  - C. Wise instruction keeps us grounded where God wants us to be. V. 17
  - D. Authenticity *protects* us from lying and slandering. V.18
  - E. <u>Brevity</u> shows integrity. V.19
  - F. Words show the condition of the *heart*. V.20-21
  - G. It is important that our words be fitting to the situation. V.31-32
- II. How can we apply these truths to our life?
  - A. Bathe difficult conversations with *prayer* before you have them.
  - **B.** Be on your <u>guard</u> against lying. Lying is not mere false statements.
  - **C.** We must be <u>wary</u> of who we are listening to.
  - **D.** We must aim to have our public reputation and our private reputation <u>match</u>.
  - E. Our angry words reveal a need to have <u>healing</u> in our soul.
  - F. We must guard our tongues to say <u>edifying</u> and not hurtful words to others.
