Who Is This? Pastor Ken Sistrunk

Matthew 21:1-10, 15-17 ¹As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent out two disciples, ²saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt beside her. Untie them and bring them to Me. ³If anyone questions you, tell him that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away." ⁴This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: ⁵"Say to the Daughter of Zion, 'See, your King comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.' ⁵So the disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. ⁷They brought the donkey and the colt and laid their cloaks on them, and Jesus sat on them. ⁸A massive crowd spread them on the road. ⁹The crowds that went ahead of Him and those that followed were shouting: "Hosanna to the Son of David!" "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest!" ¹⁰When Jesus had entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?"

¹⁵But the chief priests and scribes were indignant when they saw the wonders He performed and the children shouting in the temple courts, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" ¹⁶"Do you hear what these children are saying?" they asked. "Yes," Jesus answered. "Have you never read: 'From the mouths of children and infants You have ordained praise'?" ¹⁷Then He left them and went out of the city to Bethany, where He spent the night. (BSB)

- **I.** What are the details of this passage?
 - **A.** This is the story of the <u>Triumphal</u> Entry. This is why we celebrate Palm Sunday.
 - **B.** This story mentions 2 donkeys, but other passages only mention one. How do we deal with apparent <u>discrepancies</u> such as this? V. 2, 7
 - **1.** We must understand the benefits of <u>multiple</u> witnesses of the same events.
 - **2.** We must defend the *purity* of these type of accounts in Scripture.
 - **C.** The two disciples trusted Jesus and did what He asked, even if it was *uncomfortable*. V. 6
 - **D.** A massive crowd welcomed Him as Messiah. V. 8-9 Hosanna means "<u>Please Save Us</u>". It also came to represent the bundles of cut branches that were laid down in the road.
 - **Psalm 118:26** Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you. (BSB)
 - E. The city began asking an important *question*. V. 10

- **II.** How can we apply these truths?
 - **A.** It is essential that we pass along to the next generation what we **believe** and why we **believe** this way.
 - **B.** It is important that we learn to <u>defend</u> what we believe to non-believers.
 - **C.** We need to <u>stretch</u> our faith and do things that God wants us to do even if it is uncomfortable.
 - **D.** We need to keep it fresh in our memory that we are saved by <u>faith</u> in the grace that only Jesus Christ can give. This protects us from arrogance and keeps us humble.
 - **E.** We must have a <u>biblically</u> based view of who Jesus is. Without this we may be worshipping the wrong God.
