Dealing With Immorality

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I Corinthians 5:1-13 ¹It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you, and of a kind that is intolerable even among pagans: A man has his father's wife. ²And you are proud! Shouldn't you rather have been stricken with grief and have removed from your fellowship the man who did this? ³Although I am absent from you in body, I am present with you in spirit, and I have already pronounced judgment on the one who did this, just as if I were present. 4When you are assembled in the name of our Lord Jesus and I am with you in spirit, along with the power of the Lord Jesus, 5 hand this man over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, so that his spirit may be saved on the Day of the Lord. ⁶Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven works through the whole batch of dough? ⁷Get rid of the old leaven, that you may be a new unleavened batch, as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. 8Therefore let us keep the feast, not with the old bread, leavened with malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and of truth. 91 wrote you in my letter not to associate with sexually immoral people. 10 was not including the sexually immoral of this world, or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters. In that case you would have to leave this world. ¹¹But now I am writing you not to associate with anyone who claims to be a brother but is sexually immoral or greedy, an idolater or a verbal abuser, a drunkard or a swindler. With such a man do not even eat. ¹²What business of mine is it to judge those outside the church? Are you not to judge those inside? ¹³God will judge those outside. "Expel the wicked man from among you." (BSB)

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
 - A. Paul is addressing the issue of Christian <u>immorality</u> in the local church.
 V. 1
 - B. Paul *chastises* them for being proud of this instead of dealing with it. V. 2
 - **C.** Paul then instructs that the Corinthian church should <u>expel</u> this immoral man from their congregation. V. 3-5 What does it mean to hand someone over to Satan?
 - **D.** Paul uses an illustration for this situation. This illustration is one of the *Passover* meal. V. 6-8
 - **E.** Paul makes it clear that there should be <u>two</u> standards of behavior for Christians and for non-believers. V. 9-13
- **II.** What can we learn from this?

- **A.** There is no way for an American pastor to lead a church using these truths without an active *membership*. In areas in which the behavior is immoral but not criminal *membership* is essential!
- **B.** We should never expect <u>non-believers</u> to measure up to our expectations of behavior.

C. Our effectiveness in reaching the lost will depend on there being a <u>gap</u> between their behavior and ours. This must be done in humility because without the forgiveness that comes from the blood of Jesus Christ we could not change either.
