## Is God a Loving God? Part 2

I Corinthians 13:5 It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no account of wrongs.

I John 4:9-10 <sup>9</sup>This is how God's love was revealed among us: God sent His one and only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. <sup>10</sup>And love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as the atoning sacrifice for our sins. (BSB)

## Intro:

- **I.** What are the details of these verses?
  - **A.** God is never <u>rude</u>. God will never speak or act in a manner that is offensive, indecent, or brings dishonor to those to whom He <u>loves</u>. V. 5
  - **B.** God is not <u>self-seeking</u>. V. 5 God never demands his own way or His own rights. He has given us choices and they are <u>real</u> choices even though He already knows what we are going to choose.
  - **C.** God is not easily <u>angered</u>. V. 5 His wrath is a <u>last</u> resort and usually means merely letting us face the consequences of our actions or in the pulling back of His protection.
  - **D.** God does not keep a tally of our <u>wrongs</u>. V. 5 Our sins keep us from having that <u>vibrant</u> relationship that He wants with us. He wants us to deal with our sins merely because He wants the best for us.
- **II.** Here are some applications of these truths.
  - **A.** Look for ways that God has already <u>revealed</u> Himself to you. We must stop looking for Him to rudely force Himself into our life.
  - **B.** Look for ways to *respond* to God that have no benefit to us whatsoever.
  - **C.** Seek him in <u>all</u> things even in times when our situation is less than desirable.
  - **D.** Forgive and *forget* past sins against us. This includes our own past mistakes.
