The Treasure

II Corinthians 4:7-18 7Now we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this surpassingly great power is from God and not from us. ⁸We are hard pressed on all sides, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed. ¹⁰We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹For we who are alive are always consigned to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our mortal body. ¹²So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you. ¹³And in keeping with what is written: "I believed, therefore I have spoken," we who have the same spirit of faith also believe and therefore speak, ¹⁴knowing that the One who raised the Lord Jesus will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you in His presence. ¹⁵All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is extending to more and more people may overflow in thanksgiving, to the glory of God. ¹⁶Therefore we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, yet our inner self is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷For our light and momentary affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory that is far beyond comparison. ¹⁸So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. (BSB)

- I. Here are the details of this passage.
 - **A.** The great power of the <u>**Gospel</u>** of Jesus Christ is compared to treasure and our earthly body is compared to jars of clay. V. 7</u>
 - B. We go through hard times, but the power of *resurrection* is within us. V. 8-10
 - **C.** Our mortal body cannot be saved, but our message of Jesus Christ becomes even more powerful when we live out our <u>*faith*</u> in Him. V. 11-12
 - **D.** We will always speak about what we really <u>believe</u>. V. 13-14
 - E. The more people hear of the grace of God, the more that God is *praised*! V. 15
 - F. We receive <u>encouragement</u> in our heart because of God's glory being revealed to others. V. 16-17
 - G. We must keep on <u>task</u> of seeking the eternal and keep a loose grip on the temporary. V. 16
- II. How can we apply this message?
 - **A.** We must evaluate the <u>value</u> that we place upon sharing our story and sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with others.
 - B. We must realize that the power of resurrection is something that should affect us <u>now</u>. This is the blessed hope that we have.
 - C. It is important to place as much emphasis on our <u>soul</u> as we place upon our body.
 - D. The amount of praise that God <u>receives</u> from our life is a sign that we are on task. So, it is helpful to evaluate the praise that God <u>receives</u> from our character and our words.
 - E. We must receive the encouragement that God is desiring to give us.
 - F. We must not let <u>anything</u> or <u>anyone</u> get us off the task that He has given us.
