Words of Nonsense

Luke 24:1-12 ¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 7'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." 8Then they remembered his words. 9When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. 10 It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹²Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

Reasonable: After a human being has died, they should be treated with <u>dignity</u>. V. 1

Reasonable: It is reasonable to believe that someone <u>rolled away</u> a heavy stone and that someone <u>stole</u> the body of Jesus. V. 2-3 Their first instinct would not be that He rose from the dead.

Unreasonable: <u>Angels</u> appeared to the women and said that Jesus had risen from the dead. V. 4-7, Mathew 28:5

Unreasonable: It is unreasonable that a claim by someone that they will <u>rise</u> <u>from the dead</u> would actually come true. V. 8 Any specific predictions are open to a high degree of skepticism.

Reasonable: It is reasonable for the disciples to think that the women <u>were</u> <u>crazy</u>. V. 9-11

Reasonable: Peter would want to <u>investigate</u> this for himself because obviously something had happened. V. 12

Conclusion: I Corinthians 1:18-19 For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written: "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate." (NIV 84)
