Here is Your Mother

Luke 14:25-26 ²⁵Large crowds were now traveling with Jesus, and He turned and said to them, ²⁶"If anyone comes to Me and does not hate his father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters—yes, even his own life—he cannot be My disciple. (BSB)

Matthew 12:46-50 ⁴⁶While Jesus was still speaking to the crowds, His mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to Him. ⁴⁷Someone told Him, "Look, Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to You." ⁴⁸But Jesus replied, "Who is My mother, and who are My brothers?" ⁴⁹Pointing to His disciples, He said, "Here are My mother and My brothers. ⁵⁰For whoever does the will of My Father in heaven is My brother and sister and mother." (BSB)

I Timothy 5:8 If anyone does not provide for his own, and especially his own household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. (BSB)

John 19:25-27 ²⁵Near the cross of Jesus stood His mother and her sister, as well as Mary the wife of Clopas and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, "Woman, here is your son." ²⁷Then He said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." So from that hour, this disciple took her into his home. (BSB)

I. Here are the details of this series of passages.

Luke 14:25-26 ²⁵Large crowds were now traveling with Jesus, and He turned and said to them, ²⁶"If anyone comes to Me and does not hate his father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters—yes, even his own life—he cannot be My disciple. (BSB)

- * Jesus often <u>challenged</u> large crowds with difficult statements meant to weed out those who were following him for the wrong reasons.
- * This statement weeded out those who had misplaced *priorities* between God and family. (See John 6:54)

Matthew 12:46-50 ⁴⁶While Jesus was still speaking to the crowds, His mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to Him. ⁴⁷Someone told Him, "Look, Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to You." ⁴⁸But Jesus replied, "Who is My mother, and who are My brothers?" ⁴⁹Pointing to His disciples, He said, "Here are My mother and My brothers. ⁵⁰For whoever does the will of My Father in heaven is My brother and sister and mother." (BSB)

- * There was a time when His own *family* did not believe in Him as being the Messiah. V. 50. (see also John 7:5 and Mark 3:21)
- * Jesus puts the family of God <u>above</u> his own earthly family.

I Timothy 5:8 If anyone does not provide for his own, and especially his own household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. (BSB)

- * We must be **faithful** to provide for our earthly family.
- * Fulfilling our earthly obligations show our *faith* in action.

John 19:25-27 ²⁵Near the cross of Jesus stood His mother and her sister, as well as Mary the wife of Clopas and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, "Woman, here is your son." ²⁷Then He said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." So from that hour, this disciple took her into his home. (BSB)

- * Jesus, even in the midst of great personal struggle, *provided* for his mother.
- * His **emphasis** was constantly on the Kingdom of God and not earthly priorities. Mary had earthly sons.
- II. How can we apply these truths?
 - * We must be faithful to our earthly **obligations**.
 - * We must surrender <u>all</u> our relationships to the control of Jesus Christ.
 - * It is idolatry to place *earthly* family over God.
 - * This idolatry leads to dysfunction. This dysfunction can be <u>repaired</u> only when the Kingdom of God becomes our #1 priority.
