Final Words of Koinonia

II Corinthians 13:11-14 ¹¹Finally, brothers, rejoice! Aim for perfect harmony, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you. ¹²Greet one another with a holy kiss. ¹³All the saints send you greetings. ¹⁴The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you. (BSB)

- I. Here are the details of this passage.
 - **A.** Paul begins with a <u>Greek</u> word that was used by Jews as a "farewell" greeting. Literally the word meant "go on your way in <u>joy</u>". V. 11
 - **B.** Paul uses a <u>musical</u> illustration to illustrate how the Corinthian church should function. V. 11 The <u>disharmony</u> came from some believing in false gospels, from some of them rejecting Paul's authority to speak into their church, and from some immoral lifestyles.
 - **C.** Paul is promoting <u>accountability</u> by asking them to encourage one another. V. 11
 - **D.** Paul encouraged them to live in the perfect **Shalom** of God. V. 11
 - E. When all of this is done, God will show up and do His part. V. 11
 - F. Paul continued to encourage appropriate touching in God's family. V. 12
 - G. The church in Macedonia wanted to greet them as well. V. 13
 - H. Paul invoked a trinitarian farewell to the church in Corinth. V. 14
- **II.** How can we put these truths into action?
 - **A.** We need to not cut corners in <u>communication</u>. The use of respectful language, honest words of encouragement, and attention to detail in <u>communication</u> is being lost in our culture.
 - **B.** A local church <u>advances</u> the Kingdom of God when its Koinonia is strong. Koinonia is our <u>spiritual</u> fellowship that the early church was devoted to.
 - **C.** A local church that is <u>healthy</u> has accountability relationships withing its fellowship.
 - **D.** The **peace** of God among its people is trait of a healthy church.
 - **E.** We must seek to reestablish healthy *touching* within our fellowship. Covid has damaged this in so many churches.
 - **F.** God is showing up <u>here!</u>
