## Dove-Vine Intervention #4 <u>The Permanent Voice</u>

**John 16:5-16** <sup>5</sup>"Now I am going to him who sent me, yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' <sup>6</sup>Because I have said these things, you are filled with grief. <sup>7</sup>But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor will not *come to you*; but if I go, I will send him *to you*. <sup>8</sup>When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment: <sup>9</sup>in regard to sin, because men do not believe in me; <sup>10</sup>in regard to righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; <sup>11</sup>and in regard to judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned. <sup>12</sup>"I have much more to say *to you*, more than you can now bear. <sup>13</sup>But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; he *will speak* only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. <sup>14</sup>He will bring glory to me by taking from what is mine and making it known to you. <sup>15</sup>All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take from what is mine and make it known *to you*. <sup>16</sup>"In a little while you will see me no more, and then after a little while you will see me." (NIV)

- I. The Holy Spirit now has a permanent voice in the world. V. 13
  - A. Notice the location of where the Spirit <u>dwells</u>. V. 7 "to you.." This is the key to understanding this passage. The point of origin for the Spirit's ministry is "YOU".
  - **B.** The world will be <u>convicted</u> by the presence of believers. V. 9 We don't need to apologize for people getting convicted by our presence.
  - C. The church is the *visible* representation of Jesus Christ. V. 10
  - **D.** The church is to <u>*claim*</u> what was earned by the sacrifice on the cross. V. 11 Judgment has come to Satan and the other powers and authorities that reject God.
- **II.** The Holy Spirit equips us for this task.
  - **A.** He gives us <u>*truth*</u>. V. 13
  - **B.** He gives us <u>authority</u>. V. 14
  - **C.** He gives us <u>gifts</u>. V. 15
- **III.** How can we apply these truths to our life.
  - A. We need to look for *opportunities* to point people toward Jesus Christ.
  - **B.** We need to use our authority to help others get <u>*victory*</u> over the enemy.
  - **C.** We must learn what our gift(s) are and start <u>using</u> them.
  - D. We must stop seeking <u>signs</u> to prove what the Holy Spirit is trying to tell us. He will make clear what was meant to be clear. Walking by faith means that we will not always have a clear sign.
