Authority and Anger #1

Matthew 23:1-12 ¹Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: ²"The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. ³So you must obey them and do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach. ⁴They tie up heavy loads and put them on men's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them. ⁵"Everything they do is done for men to see: They make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long; ⁶they love the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; ⁵they love to be greeted in the marketplaces and to have men call them 'Rabbi.' ⁶"But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have only one Master and you are all brothers. ⁶And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven. ¹⁰Nor are you to be called 'teacher,' for you have one Teacher, the Christ. ¹¹The greatest among you will be your servant. ¹²For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted. (NIV 84)

This is the beginning of a mini-series in which we look at Jesus's response when he was angry at the spiritual leaders of His day.

- I. Jesus acknowledges their *authority*.
 - **A.** The people still need to <u>respect</u> the seat of authority that their spiritual leaders have.V.2
 - B. *Obeying* this authority is important. V. 3
 - C. However, their sinful actions should not be *imitated*. V. 3
- **II.** What are some of the sinful *actions* that the leaders do?
 - **A.** They put burdens on people but are unwilling to <u>help</u> them with these burdens. V. 4 There is a difference between a load and a burden.
 - **B.** Their righteousness is only for <u>show</u>. V. 5-6
 - **C.** They love their <u>titles</u>. V. 7-11 Their titles that they love were: rabbi, father, teacher.
 - **D.** They have worldly aspirations of greatness and do not understand God's <u>view</u> of greatness. V. 11-12
- III. Here are some important lessons on dealing with sinful spiritual leaders.
 - **A.** God's word still must be <u>obeyed</u> even regarding the way that you treat them. Romans 13:1-2 Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. ²Consequently, he who rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. (NIV 84)
 - **B.** Always weigh what they teach with <u>Scripture</u>. If it doesn't match with Scripture do not obey them. Obey God rather than man.
 - **C.** When <u>choosing</u> spiritual leaders look for humility and a loving spirit. Many gifted people lack these important characteristics.
 - **D.** Never put another <u>human</u> in place of where God is supposed to be. This works both ways: Don't elevate them to deity and don't expect them to be perfect.
