## **The Straight Line**

**Matthew 18:15-20** <sup>15</sup>"If your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over. <sup>16</sup>But if he will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' <sup>17</sup>If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax collector. <sup>18</sup>"I tell you the truth, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. <sup>19</sup>"Again, I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. <sup>20</sup>For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them."

- **I.** The need for **straight** lines. V. 15
  - **A.** The <u>war seed</u> is made up of three parts: the victim, the rescuer, and the persecutor.
  - **B.** God's *peace* plan begins with one-on-one healthy relationships. V. 15
  - C. The "peace-making scale"
    - 1. A Grace-Check: Proverbs 19:11
      - <sup>11</sup>A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his glory to overlook an offense. (NIV 84)
    - 2. A *Gentle* Restoration: Matthew 5:23-24
      - <sup>23</sup>"Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, <sup>24</sup>leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift. (NIV 84)
    - 3. A <u>Give</u> and <u>Take</u> Peacemaking: Philippians 2:4
      <sup>4</sup>Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. (NIV 84)
    - 4. A Non-Biased Council: Matthew 18:16
      - <sup>16</sup>But if he will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' (NIV 84)
    - 5. A *Consensus* Agreement: I Corinthians 6:4
      - <sup>4</sup>Therefore, if you have disputes about such matters, appoint as judges even men of little account in the church! (NIV 84)
    - 6. A Binding Decision: Matthew 18:17
      - <sup>17</sup>If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax collector. (NIV 84)
