Proverbs Series #5: Moral Discipline

Proverbs 5:7-23 ⁷So now, my sons, listen to me, and do not turn aside from the words of my mouth. ⁸Keep your path far from her; do not go near the door of her house, ⁹lest you concede your vigor to others, and your years to one who is cruel; ¹⁰lest strangers feast on your wealth, and your labors enrich the house of a foreigner. ¹¹At the end of your life you will groan when your flesh and your body are spent, 12 and you will say, "How I hated discipline, and my heart despised reproof! 13I did not listen to the voice of my teachers or incline my ear to my mentors. ¹⁴I am on the brink of utter ruin in the midst of the whole assembly." ¹⁵Drink water from your own cistern, and running water from your own well. ¹⁶Why should your springs flow in the streets, your streams of water in the public squares? ¹⁷Let them be yours alone, never to be shared with strangers. ¹⁸May your fountain be blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth: ¹⁹A loving doe, a graceful fawn— may her breasts satisfy you always; may you be captivated by her love forever. ²⁰Why be captivated, my son, by an adulteress, or embrace the bosom of a stranger? ²¹ For a man's ways are before the eyes of the LORD, and the LORD examines all his paths. ²²The iniquities of a wicked man entrap him; the cords of his sin entangle him. ²³He dies for lack of discipline, led astray by his own great folly. (BSB)

- **I.** What are the details of this passage?
 - **A.** The main theme of this passage is **abstaining** from sexual immorality. V. 7-8
 - 1. We lose our witnessing power when we willfully commit sin. V. 9
 - 2. We give our *time* to someone who doesn't care about us. V. 9
 - 3. Our wealth is given to people who do not share our values. V. 10
 - 4. We waste our youth on sin instead of God's kingdom. V. 11
 - **B.** Discipline combined with *accountability* keeps us on task. V. 12-13
 - C. We <u>risk</u> having children out of wedlock and we <u>risk</u> disease. V. 14
 - **D.** God has given us <u>safe</u> boundaries for our sexuality. V. 15-20
 - **E.** We are accountable to **God**, who sees all that we do. V. 21-23
- **II.** What are some ways to apply these truths?
 - **A.** Our *morality* is a great witnessing opportunity. This generation struggles with long term marriages. Our long term marriages will cause them to be curious how we did it.
 - **B.** Our passions must be channeled to *godly* pursuits.
 - **C.** Our wealth must be spent in **blessing** the activities that are god-honoring.
 - **D.** We will be healthier if we stay within the <u>boundaries</u> that God has given us.
 - E. We need to realize that we may fool others but we *cannot* fool God.
