## Proverbs Series #9: Word Wisdom

## **Proverbs 10**

- **I.** Here are the key verses in this passage that have to do with the use of our words.
  - <sup>1</sup>The proverbs of Solomon:...
  - <sup>6</sup>Blessings are on the head of the righteous, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence.
  - <sup>8</sup>A wise heart will receive commandments, but foolish lips will come to ruin.
  - <sup>10</sup>He who winks the eye causes grief, and foolish lips will come to ruin.
  - <sup>11</sup>The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence.
  - <sup>12</sup>Hatred stirs up dissension, but love covers all transgressions.
  - <sup>13</sup>Wisdom is found on the lips of the discerning, but a rod is for the back of him who lacks judgment.
  - <sup>14</sup>The wise store up knowledge, but the mouth of the fool invites destruction.
  - <sup>18</sup>The one who conceals hatred has lying lips, and whoever spreads slander is a fool.
  - <sup>19</sup>When words are many, sin is unavoidable, but he who restrains his lips is wise.
  - <sup>20</sup>The tongue of the righteous is choice silver, but the heart of the wicked has little worth.
  - <sup>21</sup>The lips of the righteous feed many, but fools die for lack of judgment.
  - <sup>31</sup>The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but a perverse tongue will be cut out.
  - <sup>32</sup>The lips of the righteous know what is fitting, but the mouth of the wicked is perverse.
- II. How can we apply the truths of this chapter?
  - **A.** Since we speak out of what is in our heart we must constantly seek **forgiveness** of ourselves and others to keep our heart free from hatred. V. 6, 10, 11, 18
  - B. We must be open to *replacing* faulty thinking with truth. V. 8,14
  - **C.** We will receive <u>blessings</u> from the words we use, and we will receive <u>judgment</u> from them as well. V. 13, 20, 21, 31
  - **D.** We must temper our words with <u>love</u>. V. 19, 32
