The Importance of a Foundation

"In Congress, July 4, 1776

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America, When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, --That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness..."

The above excerpt is from the Declaration of Independence of the United States of America. It is hard to believe that we are nearing the 250th anniversary of this declaration. It seems just like yesterday it was 1976 and we were celebrating our Bicentennial Anniversary as a country. I want to print this part of the Declaration of Independence to show the importance of a foundational belief in the existence of God to our foundation as a country. I am deeply concerned that the younger generations have rejected our foundation and are seeking to usher in a different type of government than the one that we inherited from our founding fathers. This push for a new form of government has at its foundation a rejection of the belief in one true God and they are pushing for a secular humanism foundation. Please pray that this will not happen. So many of our God given rights are at stake if we abandon our foundation.

Our founding fathers were not perfect, but they did create a unique country that has been a world power ever since this declaration was presented. This country of ours has brought freedom to so many people over its nearly 250 years of existence. While I am not a fan of turning America into a Theocratic state, I am a fan of keeping what we have inherited from our Founding Fathers. We have inherited a democratic republic that is based upon a belief in a creator who has endowed us with inalienable rights. These rights are the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

May we keep this democratic republic true to its foundation and stay true to the God that is mentioned often in this declaration.

This is a fiction book about spiritual warfare. Even though it written in 1986, it still speaks today.

The back cover describes the book as one "that rivals *The Screwtape Letters* with its keen insight into spiritual warfare and the necessity of prayer." I have read this book twice over the years and will reread it again.

The plot is about a typical small town named Ashton. "But when a skeptical reporter and a prayerful pastor begin to compare notes, they suddenly find themselves fighting a hideous New Age plot to subjugate the townspeople, and eventually the entire human race." (back cover)
